

CARRY-ON ITEMS, STROLLERS & CHILD CAR SEATS

No more than two carry-on items and must be small enough to place in your lap or between your feet and weigh no more than 10 lbs.

Collapsible strollers only are allowed and must be kept between your feet.

Child seats are not provided and are required in Kayak buses that are 15 passenger or smaller. Accompanying adult is responsible for belting in car seats and children.

SERVICE ANIMALS

When it is not obvious what service an animal provides, only limited inquiries are allowed. Staff may ask two questions (1) is the dog a service animal and (2) what work or task has the dog been trained to perform.

Service animals must be under the control of the owner at all times. A service animal showing inappropriate behavior that is not corrected and brought under control may be denied transportation.

Bicycles on Kayak Vehicles

Bicyclists are responsible for securing and carefully moving their bicycles on and off Kayak buses.

Bicyclists are responsible for any personal injuries or loss as a result of their negligence in not securing the bicycle properly on the bike rack.

Kayak Public Transit transports only single seat, two-wheeled, no fueled bicycles on its vehicles.

Bicycles are allowed on the bicycle rack only and not inside the bus.

Rack holds a maximum of 2 bicycles and are on a first come first served basis.



Rules for Riding

Arrive at bus stop at least 5 minutes early to avoid being missed or not being seen approaching the bus stop.

Rules for Riding

Children under age 10 must be accompanied by an adult.

FIXED-ROUTE BUS & COMMUTER BUS SERVICE

No special request stops. Paratransit service is offered within $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile from our Hermiston Hart, Mission Metro and Tutuilla Tripper bus stop locations and is for passengers not capable of using the fixed route system. Call Dispatch for more information.

PRIORITY SEATING

In priority seating areas, you will be asked to move for seniors and people with disabilities. (Front seats and seats that fold up for wheel chairs)

PETS

All pets must be in a pet carrier that will remain secured. Pet and carrier cannot exceed a total of 25 pounds.

FOOD & DRINKS

No eating on the bus. Drinks allowable in closable, spill-proof containers (travel mugs, water bottles with secure lids). No alcoholic beverages allowed in travel mugs or travel bottles.

RESPECT RIDERS & DRIVERS

It is criminal to threaten the safety of a rider, driver or interfere with the operation or movement of a vehicle.

NOISE LEVEL

Speak courteously and at a reasonable volume while in conversation with fellow riders and operators or when using a cell phone.

Do not disrupt or distract vehicle operators.

Electronics are allowable when used with headphones that cannot be heard by other riders.

LOST AND FOUND

Kayak Public Transit is not responsible for damaged, lost or stolen property.

A CLEAN, ENJOYABLE, SAFE RIDE

- Wear your seatbelt
- Shirts and shoes must be worn
- No use or public display of tobacco products. No vaping
- No littering, no vandalizing or defacing Kayak property
- No hazardous, explosive, or corrosive materials (including empty gas cans or vehicle batteries)
- No unlawful weapons or firearms
- No illegal substances
Marijuana is an illegal drug under the laws of the Confederated Tribes of the Umatilla Indian Reservation and under federal law. Persons possessing marijuana within the exterior boundaries of the Umatilla Indian Reservation will be prosecuted either in Tribal or federal court; as such, marijuana in any form is not permitted on Kayak vehicles regardless of location.
- No soliciting
- No foul and/or threatening language
- No bags of empty cans or bottles

EXPULSION OR SUSPENSION

Violating rider rules or other federal, state, or local laws on a Kayak Public Transit vehicle may result in expulsion or suspension. Suspensions may be appealed, please contact Dispatch regarding appeals.
