## 2024 COLUMBIA RIVER FALL SEASON EMERGENCY REGULATIONS

Pursuant to Chapter 2 of the Fish and Wildlife Code of the Confederated Tribes of the Umatilla Indian Reservation, the Fish and Wildlife Commission has the authority to establish regulations for Umatilla ceremonial, subsistence, and commercial fisheries. Pursuant to that authority, the Fish and Wildlife Commission adopted the following regulations.

## HOOK AND LINE FISHERIES DOWNSTREAM OF BONNEVILLE DAM

**Area:** Below Bonneville Dam, as agreed to in CTUIR MOU and tribal regulations

**Dates:** 12:01 AM Thursday August 1, 2024 until 11:59 PM Thursday October 31, 2024.

Gear: Hoop nets, dip/ bag nets, and rod reel with hook and line.

Allowable Sales: Salmon (all species), steelhead, shad, yellow perch, bass, walleye, catfish and carp may be sold or retained for subsistence. Sturgeon retention is prohibited; sturgeon may not be sold or retained for ceremonial or subsistence purposes. Sales may not occur on USACE property. Sales of fish caught during open gillnet periods are allowed after the end of the open period, as long as the fish were landed during the open period.

## PLATFORM/HOOK AND LINE FISHERIES IN ZONE 6

Area: All of Zone 6.

**Dates:** 12:01 AM Thursday August 1, 2024 until 6 PM Tuesday December 31, 2024.

**Gear:** Hoop nets, dip/bag nets, and rod reel with hook and line.

**Allowable Sales:** Salmon (all species), steelhead, shad, yellow perch, bass, walleye, catfish and carp may be sold or retained for subsistence. Sturgeon may not be sold, but sturgeon from 43 to 54 inches fork length in The Dalles and John Day Pools and from 38 to 54 inches fork length in the Bonneville Pool may be kept for subsistence purposes. Sales of fish caught during open gillnet periods are allowed after the end of the open period, as long as the fish were landed during the open period.
