Veterans Day is November 11th.

- Originated as "Armistice Day" on Nov. 11, 1919 the first anniversary of the end of World War I. Congress passed a resolution in 1926 for an annual observance, and Nov. 11 became a national holiday beginning in 1938. Unlike Memorial Day, Veterans Day pays tribute to all American veterans-living or dead- but especially gives thanks to living veterans who served their country honorably during war or peacetime.
- American Indians and Alaskan Natives serve in the Armed Forces at five-

times the national average and have served with distinction in every major conflict for over 200 years. Considering the population of the U.S. is approximately 1.4 percent Native and the military is 1.7 percent Native (not including those that did not disclose their identity), Native people have the highest per-capita involvement of any population to serve in the U.S. military. They also have higher concentration of women servicemembers than all other groups. Nearly 20 percent of American Indians and Alaska Natives servicemenbers were women, while 15.6 percent of all other servicemenbers were women.

The Homeownership Program now under NCFS owned & operated by CTUIR. They're working on being a Native Community Development Financial Institution (CDFI).

One of their programs offers opportunity for a CTUIR Tribal member to learn how to get a mortgage on CTUIR with the Financial and Homebuyer Education Classes.

- Financial coaching is a must and mainly about you understanding how to control your finances and not let it control you. Assess your credit report to establish a budget plan and start to save & be loan ready.

-Homeownership counseling, once you establish your credit report then explore what kind of home for you and the family. Do you want to build or purchase is the question.

- 99-year lease on CTUIR. This was passed by CTUIR and the tribe went through a time consuming process for approval with outside entities such as: USDA, BIA, HUD, Veterans & others to establish a framework formalizing the lease for tribal lands. This was key for a mortgage on tribal lands.

- Now you can call for more information about mortgages and 99-year lease at NCFS and CTUIR Tribal Planning Department.
