## 2026 COLUMBIA RIVER SPRING SEASON EMERGENCY REGULATIONS

*Pursuant to Chapter 2 of the Fish and Wildlife Code of the Confederated Tribes of the Umatilla Indian Reservation, the Fish and Wildlife Commission has the authority to establish regulations for Umatilla ceremonial, subsistence, and commercial fisheries. Pursuant to that authority, the Fish and Wildlife Commission adopted the following regulations.*

### PLATFORM/HOOK AND LINE FISHERY

- Area:** All of Zone 6
- Dates:** 6AM Thursday May 28, 2026 through June 15 (end of the Spring Management Period).
- Gear:** Hoop Nets/Bag Nets, Dip Nets and rod and reel with hook and line.
- Restrictions:** Standard river mouth and dam sanctuaries applicable to these gear types.
- Allowable Sales:** Salmon (all species), steelhead caught after 6AM on May 28 may be sold or kept for subsistence. Shad, yellow perch, bass, walleye, catfish and carp may be sold or retained for subsistence. Sturgeon may not be sold, but sturgeon from 43 to 54 inches fork length in The Dalles and John Day Pools and from 38 to 54 inches fork length in the Bonneville Pool may be kept for subsistence purposes. Sales of fish caught during open periods are allowed after the end of the open period, as long as the fish were landed during the open period.
