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Dear Young People, are you planning to remain living at home for awhile, or do you want to try living on your own soon? If you want to be prepared for a successful move, please read these tips from Housing Department:

- Know Your Gross Annual Income. Calculate your total gross (how much you make before taxes and fees) monthly income and times that by 12. This is how much money you make in a year.
- Know the Application. Read ALL of the rental application, they
  may have specific requirements and documents that are required.
- Gather Your Papers. You may need your birth certificate, social security card, driver's license or ID, and tribal ID. Like CTUIR Housing, some low-income property managements may require copies of some of these documents to be submitted with your application. You will want to keep, as proof of income, your most recent work paystubs. Also, keep trust/dividend paystubs. Tribes may not consider these as "taxable income" but a landlord may see it as a reliable source of paying your rent/utility obligations.
- Think roommate. To share the financial burden, ask someone you *trust* to share a rental with. Be cautious about choosing just anyone. You want to choose someone who has the same goals as you, and can take the responsibility that comes with being a successful renter.

• **Be Prepared.** Some landlords or rental property managements require an *Application Fee* and they are usually not refundable. Be

- **Be Diligent.** Finding a rental in this area can be stressful and a long wait. With the current housing shortage, you should apply months in advance before you are ready to make the move. Hopefully the waiting will give you the time to procure the income needed to provide yourself a future home. Don't give up, & good luck!
- **Friendly tips from Maintenance,** When requesting work order let them know if they can enter unit or schedule when you are able to be present.
- If you smell a gas leak call Cascade Natural Gas 888-522-1130.
- Please do not unplug smoke/CO2 detectors, call Housing.
- Please do not over fill your garbage can, any damages to container please call TERF 276-4040.
- To deter pests in your unit is to clean up old food, spills, crumbs, and garbage cleaned up in the kitchen.
- LAWN's are being cut please keep your areas clean of debris & mark any plants you don't want mowed down.

# Housing Veteran & Elder Development

#### **Oregon Housing & Community Services**



The past few years CTUIR Development team has been working with OHCS application to build 17 low income rentals, 10 for elders and 7 for Veteran. The OHCS has a grant process that's going to pay for development cost, the place is across from Yellowhawk and NCS.

Project Manager Wenaha have meeting diligently with Veterans Committee and Elders Committee getting input, ideas and how they want it to look, which so far is practical, realistic and function for every day living. But more importantly affordable and quality. So the teams been meeting with success and the application is due in August and will report to both Board of Trustees and General Council.

The application process will take OHCS some 30 days to process and get back to CTUIR. In hopes it gets final approval looking at 2026 sometime hopefully for groundbreaking, stay tuned in the CUJ and GC.

A. Zero-Rent Tenant Utility Responsibilities. Tenants who qualify for zero-rent housing are still responsible for paying for trash service, gas, and excess water utility charges.
