

## Q: When can I put out campaign signs?

A: Signs can be placed starting Saturday, September 30, 2023. And they *must* be removed by Wednesday, November 29, 2023.

# Q: Where and how can I put up signs?

### On Private Property

- You must have the property owner's permission
- Signs must not be larger than 16 ft<sup>2</sup>in size, though they may have words/images on both sides of the sign
- Signs must be secured to a building, fence posts, or other immovable object

#### In the Right-of-Way & Public Squares

- The CTUIR Board of Trustees has identified 3 public square areas to place signs for this election (see the attached map for those approved locations)
- Signs may not be any larger than 4 ft<sup>2</sup> in size, though they may have words/images on both sides of the sign
- Signs must be at least 5 feet away from the roadway/edge of pavement
- Signs must be at least 75 feet away from any voting place
- Don't attach signs to any public property or post them in a way that could damage public property
- Signs should be constructed on stakes that can be pressed into the ground by hand. Do not place signs that require digging or driving posts into the ground to install
- Signs cannot be grouped together to form a chained message (see the attached diagram for example)

# Q: What happens if I don't follow the rules?

**A:** If any of your campaign signs violate the rules, you will receive a warning and be asked to modify or remove the sign. If you do not remove the sign or fix it so that it meets the rules within 48 hours, you may receive a citation from CTUIR, which may be referred to Tribal Court.
