State of Washington American Indian Residency Bill:

CTUIR tribal members are eligible for in-state tuition status, contact your admissions office to see what tribal documents you need to submit. Usually a copy of your tribal ID will work. http://www.wsac.wa.gov/student-residency

According to RCW 28B.15.0131, American Indian students who meet the following two conditions qualify for Washington resident tuition.

- 1. For a period of one year immediately prior to enrollment at a state institution of higher education, the student must have been domiciled in one or a combination of the following states: Idaho, Montana, Oregon, or Washington.
- 2. The student must be a member of one of the federally recognized tribes whose traditional and customary tribal boundaries included portions of the state of Washington, or whose tribe was granted reserved lands within the state of Washington.

September

Available: Summer Deadline: September

FAFSA® Application | Federal Student Aid

Available: October 1st

Seniors may begin completing the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) form online starting October 1.

Horatio Alger Scholarship

Available: August Deadline: October 15

As one of the nation's largest need-based college scholarship programs in the country, the Horatio Alger Scholarship Programs specifically assist high school students who have faced and overcome great obstacles in their young lives. While many programs are directed primarily to recognizing academic achievement or

leadership potential, the Horatio Alger Association seeks students who have exhibited determination, integrity, and perseverance in overcoming adversity, as well as have critical financial need.

\$1,000 College JumpStart Scholarship

Available: April **Deadline:** October 17

Applicants must be high school juniors or seniors or adult students. Applicants may study any major and attend any college in the U.S. Applicants must be legal residents of the United States and complete the online application form including the required personal statement.

Dr. Pepper Tuition Giveaway

Available: August **Deadline:** October 17

If you're a student between the ages of 18-24 you can tell us your one of a kind story to enter. You'll be eligible to submit a video once you reach 50 votes. Dr. Pepper will select finalists for a chance to compete to win up to \$100,000 in tuition at a college football championship game.

U.S. Bank Scholarship

Available: April **Deadline:** Oct 25

Jack Kent Cook Foundation

Available: open **Deadline:** October 30

VFW Voice of Democracy Scholarship

Available: open **Deadline:** November 5

NCWIT Award for Aspirations in Computing honors young women at the high-school level for their computing-related achievements and interests. Awardees are selected for their computing and IT aptitude, leadership ability, academic history, and plans for post-secondary education.

Prudential Spirit of Community Awards

Available: open **Deadline:** November 10

Youth recognition program based on volunteer community service. The program was created to honor high school students for outstanding service to others at the local, state, and national level.

Elks National Foundation, Most Valuable Student

Available: August **Deadline:** November 15

There will be 500 four-year scholarships awarded to the highest-rated applicants. You need not be related to a member of the Elks. Male and female compete separately. Applicants will be judged on scholarship, leadership and financial need. Applicants must advance through local, district and state competitions to reach national judging.

Deadline: November 30

December

National Honor Society Scholarship Program

Available: October **Deadline:** December 1

Currently affiliated, active NHS chapters may participate in the NHS Scholarship program and nominate students for scholarships. Nominees must be senior (12th grade) NHS member students in good standing, generally meaning they continue to meet their chapters standards and obligation.

Advance Prevention Lawsuit Legal Scholarship

Available: open **Deadline:** December 5

\$1,000 for U.S. high school seniors seeking a degree in an accredited four year university. Provide support in financial awards to students working to build skills and advance their education.

Generation Google Scholarship

Available: August **Deadline:** December 4

The Generation Google Scholarship was established to help aspiring computer scientists excel in technology and become leaders in the field. Selected students will receive \$10,000.

AXA Achievement Community Scholarship | KCK Scholarships

Available: September **Deadline:** December 15

Applicants must demonstrate ambition and self-drive as evidenced by outstanding achievement in school, community or work-related activities. Special consideration will be given to achievements that empower society to better face risk through education and action in area such as financial, environmental, health and/or emergency-preparedness.

Burger King Foundation

Available: October **Deadline:** December 15

Scholarship grants range from \$1000 to \$50,000, and are intended to help students offset the cost of attending college or post-secondary vocational/technical school. Recipients are selected based on their GPA, work experience, extracurricular activities and/or community service.

Odenza Marketing Group Volunteer Scholarships

Available: open **Deadline** December 30

The main goal is to encourage students to make a positive contribution to their individual communities, while providing scholarship awards to those who have done so over the previous 12 months.

Society for American Archaeology Available: Fall **Deadline:** December

The scholarships supports students of archaeological training for Native Americans, employees of tribes, Alaskan Native, or Native Hawaiian and their cultural preservation programs.

January

GE-Reagan Foundation

Available: October **Deadline:** January 3

Each year, the program selects numerous recipients to receive a \$10,000 scholarship renewable for up to an additional three years-up to \$40,000 total per recipient. In addition, Scholars are invited to participate in a special awards program. Awarded to students who demonstrate exemplary leadership, drive, integrity and citizenship.

Carson Scholars Fund, Inc. \$1,000

Available: October **Deadline:** January 10

An interested student must be nominated by an educator at his or her school to be able to compete for a Carson Scholarship. Only one student from each school can apply, ensuring that each nominee epitomizes academic excellence. Carson Scholars must have a minimum GPA of 3.75 and display humanitarian qualities through community service. Scholarships are awarded solely based on academic achievement and humanitarian qualities, without regard to financial need, ethnicity, creed or religion.

Pride Foundation

Available: October Deadline: January 10

(Oregon) Pride Foundation provides 50 different post-secondary educational scholarships to current and future leaders in the lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer (LGBTQ), and straight ally community from Alaska, Idaho, Montana, Oregon and Washington.

Providian Medical Scholarship

Available: November **Deadline:** January 15

Must submit an original essay of up to 1,500 words that describes how medical equipment technology has changed the face of a college course and curriculum. Entries can also include how this area of study will continue to evolve and advance.

AAIA Undergrad Scholarships

Available: May Deadline: January 31

These five scholarship will continue to fund your college career if accepted. \$1,500 available each year. Must be enrolled in your tribe; must be attending an accredited school full time both fall and spring semesters; must be seeking an Associate's or Bachelor's degree. Open to high school seniors who will be entering college in the fall, College Freshman, sophomores, juniors and seniors.

Alice Madden Barton Cosmetology School Scholarship

Available: September **Deadline:** January 31

At Great Clips, we encourage you to show the world what you're all about. To make it easier, Great Clips provides over \$100,000 in scholarships and professional tools to cosmetology students each year! The scholarship award and professional tools are valued \$250 - \$1,500.

February

Washington State University MOU Tribal Scholarship

Available: Open **Deadline:** February 1

The MOU Tribal Scholarship was developed through the Provost Office of WSU for members of tribes that are signatory to a Memorandum of Understanding with WSU. The MOU Scholarship is for new incoming freshmen students and transfer students. A student is considered a freshman if they have fewer than 27 Transfer College credits.

Thornton FFA Scholarship

Available: November **Deadline**: February 4

This scholarship has been established to encourage FFA members in the state of Oregon to pursue higher educational opportunities in agriculture with the ultimate goal of seeking a career in agriculture, not limited to production agriculture, but to include agribusiness and veterinary medicine.

AMS Freshman Undergraduate Scholarship

Available: November **Deadline:** February 7

The American Meteorological Society is pleased to announce the AMS Freshman Undergraduate Scholarship program, open to all high school students and designed to encourage study in the atmospheric and related sciences.

AMS Minority Scholarships

Available: November **Deadline:** February

Scholarship is open to minority students who will be entering their freshman year of college in the fall and are planning to pursue careers in the atmospheric or related oceanic and hydrologic sciences

Davidson Fellows Scholarship

Available: November **Deadline**: February 12

The Davidson Fellows Scholarship awards \$50,000, \$25,000 and \$10,000 scholarships to extraordinary young people, 18 and under, who have completed a significant piece of work. Application categories are Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics, Literature, Music, Philosophy and Outside the Box.

OSAC Scholarships

Available: Open **Deadline:** February 14 (early bird deadline)

One easy application for more than \$15 million in scholarship awards available. Scholarships are available for graduates of specific high schools, students interested in a certain subject, and many other types of students.

National FFA Scholarship Program

Available: November Deadline: February 15

The selection process takes into account the whole student - FFA involvement, work experience, Supervised Agricultural Experience (SAE), community service, leadership skills and academics. More than 1,500 scholarships are available with just one application to complete for eligibility. Applicants must have been FFA members for 4 years, have completed a SAE Ag experience project, have participated in district or state activities, served in an FFA leadership role, and be studying in an Ag related field.

National Society Daughters of the American Revolution

Available: open **Deadline:** February 15

The NSDAR awards multiple scholarships to students showing dedication to the pursuit of degrees in diverse disciplines including history, law, nursing, and education. All multi-year scholarships, typically renewable up to four years, must be for consecutive years of attendance at an accredited college or university in the United States. The only exception is the American Indian Scholarship that is available for students pursuing vocational training.

Association of Computer Professionals, Northwest

Available: December **Deadline:** February 28th

Scholarships are available to graduating high school seniors who have been actively involved in the use of technology during their high school careers and are planning to pursue studies in a technology related field.

March

Chafee Education and Training Grant

Available: Open **Deadline:** March 1

Funding to help current or former foster care youth with postsecondary education and training.

<u>Scholarships – Umatilla Electric Cooperative</u>

Available: Open **Deadline:** March 1

This program is designed to encourage and recognize the academic achievements of the members of UEC and/or their dependent children. This recognition will be in the form of scholarships to assist with their college education. To apply online, you must complete the state's OSAC scholarship application. The applicant is responsible for submitting all necessary information to apply for a scholarship.

Ford Family Foundation Ford Scholars Program

Available: Fall **Deadline:** March 1

The Ford Scholars Program is open to graduating high school seniors as well as continuing community college students who are seeking a bachelor's degree and are ready to transfer to a four-year college.

Oregon Community Foundation Scholarships

Available: January **Deadline:** March 1 (through OSAC)

With more than 330 scholarship funds that make higher education and training more accessible, OCF has one of the largest scholarship programs of its kind in the country. Every year, we award more than \$6.7 million through 2,400 scholarships.

Oregon Opportunity Grant

Available: October Deadline: March 1

It is available to students who qualify for Federal Pell Grants and awarded for those attending Oregon posthigh schools on first-come, first-granted. OSAC encourages applicants to submit their FAFSA as soon after October 1st as possible to ensure priority consideration for a grant. OSAC will award grants until funds are depleted, which has occurred around February 1st.

OWLS Award from **OIT**

Available: Open **Deadline:** March 1

Opportunity for Working and Learning STEM. Incoming freshman students who have earned 9 or more college credits in a science, technology, engineering or math course, with at least a grade of B or better.

ACS Scholars Program

Available: November **Deadline:** March 1

Scholarship is open to African American, Hispanic/Latino, and American Indian students who are graduating high school seniors or college freshmen, sophomores or juniors intending to or already majoring in chemistry, biochemistry, chemical engineering or a chemically-related science.

The Maureen L. & Howard N. Blitman, P.E.

Available: Open **Deadline:** March 1

This scholarship is available to underrepresented ethnic minorities in the field of engineering: African American, Hispanic, or Native American. The scholarship recipient needs to be accepted into an ABET-Accredited engineering program at a four year college or university and is a U.S. Citizen

Northwest Farm Credit Services Scholarships

Available: open **Deadline:** March 1

Northwest FCS is committed to higher education and helping customers' and employees' children achieve their educational goals. Scholarships are awarded annually to high school seniors, current college students and those pursuing graduate degrees. All scholarships are \$2,000 each.

Oregon Farm Bureau Scholarships

Available: January **Deadline:** March 1

Several scholarships available see website for list.

Trail Blazer Scholarship

Available: November **Deadline:** March 1

The Trail Blazers and Wesley Matthews are introducing a brand new college scholarship program sponsored by Wells Fargo. High school seniors with a 3.0 GPA in Oregon and Clark County, Washington are eligible to apply for a \$5,000 college scholarship towards a 4-year, 2-year, or trade school education. Six high school seniors will be awarded.

Oregon Community Leadership Scholarship

Available: September **Deadline:** March 6

This is a renewable four-year scholarship program for Oregon high school seniors who are emerging leaders, and plan to attend an Oregon university or trade school. The program is intended to facilitate the growth of promising leaders in the state of Oregon by developing the skills needed to flourish their local communities. By helping to open doors in the business sector, these emerging leaders will remain planted and invested in the state of Oregon. This is a need-based scholarship with criteria focusing on an individual's involvements in his or her community, rather than academic or athletic performance.

COSA Youth Development Program

Available: Open **Deadline:** March 2

Each year COSA sponsors or assists in processing eight \$1,000 college scholarships. These scholarships are given to Oregon seniors attending 2 or 4- year Oregon colleges. Scholarships are for need-based students entering the field of engineering, education, students involved with leadership, young women entering the field of education or a deserving Latino student.

NIADA Foundation Regional Scholarships for High School Seniors (helptostudy.com)

Available: open **Deadline:** March 9

The NIADA Foundation proudly sponsors four young men or women each year who have displayed outstanding abilities in education. These students will each receive a \$3,500 scholarship sponsored by Manheim to the college or university of their choice. The awards are presented each June of every year at the National Independent Automobile Dealers Association (NIADA) Convention.

Truman D. Picard Scholarship

Available: November **Deadline:** March 13

Scholarship is open to graduating high school seniors and current undergraduate and graduate students who are Native American and pursuing a higher education in Natural Resources.

Red & Gena Leonard Scholarship

Available: Open **Deadline:** March 15

For students who have a high financial need; average grade; desire to work in a trade; must attend an Oregon College or trade school (unless the training you need is not offered in Oregon).

Catching the Dream

Available: Open **Deadline:** March 15

Summer session due date. Catching the Dream, formerly known as the Native American Scholarship Fund, makes grants to Native college students and works to improve Indian schools. Our ultimate goal is to have you being able to go to college with no loans and have your expenses totally covered.

College Foundation of North Carolina (cfnc.org)

Available: Open **Deadline:** March 15

This scholarship seeks low income, underrepresented and first generation college prospects who are passionate about furthering their education as a means to help out their family, community and themselves.

Guy Davis OSEA Scholarship

Available: Open Deadline: March 15

This scholarship is for graduating seniors and it awards \$1,250 to each recipient. To be eligible, applicants must have a relative who is an OSEA member and have a minimum high school cumulative GPA of 3.0.

Oregon Association of Secondary School Administrators

Available: Open **Deadline:** March 16

The OASSA awards two \$1,000 scholarships each year to graduating seniors from Oregon public high schools. The scholarships may be used for a 2 or 4-year College, university, trade, or professional/technical school. These two scholarships are for a son, daughter, or dependent child of an OASSA member. Each Scholarship application must be signed and endorsed by an active COSA member, such as a principal, assistant principal, central office administrator or superintendent.

Scholarships | AISES

Application: December **Deadline:** March 31

Open to students who will be a college freshmen (in the 2020-2021 school year) attending a minority serving four-year college/university as a full-time student majoring in a STEM field. The college/university must also have an ABET accredited Engineering program. This award consists of a one-time \$10,000 scholarship awarded during the freshman year; and an opportunity to apply for summer employment, which provides technical work experience and continued tuition assistance.

Burlington Northern Santa Fe Foundation Scholarship

Application: December **Deadline:** March 31

Administered by AISES for the Burlington Northern Santa Fe Foundation, this scholarship is made available to American Indian high school seniors who reside in one of the 13 states serviced by the Burlington Northern and Santa Fe Pacific Corporation and its affiliated companies: Arizona, California, Colorado, Kansas, Minnesota, Montana, New Mexico, North Dakota, Oklahoma, Oregon, South Dakota, Texas and Washington. This award is for four years (for a maximum of 8 semesters) or until baccalaureate degree is obtained, whichever occurs first. Those awarded must maintain a 2.5 GPA their freshman and sophomore years and a 3.0 GPA their junior and senior years to receive full award.

April

Jiggs & Maxine Fisk Memorial Scholarship

Available: Open **Deadline:** April 1st

The Pendleton Foundation Trust offers the annual \$5,000 Fisk Scholarship to a deserving Pendleton Senior student who will graduate with at least a 3.0 GPA. The award honors Jiggs and Maxine who were generous supporters of the Trust. The award is given for scholarship and activities and is not based on financial need.

First Community Credit Union

Available: Winter **Deadline:** April 2

The First Community Founders Scholarship was established to help support students, throughout the communities we serve to afford the cost of higher education. Must be a member of or have an immediate family member who is a member of First Community Credit Union.

Walmart Foundation Scholarship

Application: January **Deadline:** April 2

Applicant must be a dependent of an associate (employee) of any division of Walmart who has been actively employed with Walmart for at least 6 consecutive months.

GFWC Fine Arts Scholarships

Available: Open Deadline: April 11

The Oregon Federation of Women's Clubs Fine Arts Scholarship Contest is for ALL graduating high school senior students (regardless of gender) who will be attending college in the fall and reside in the State of Oregon. It's a contest that is taking place in Grant Park Church at 2728 NE 34th Ave., Portland OR.

Shawn Carter Foundation Scholarship

Available: April **Deadline:** April 30

The SCFS provides individuals grants that can be used to cover tuition expenses and related supplemental educational expenses such as books. All Shawn Carter Scholars are required to "give back" to the community and by serving as mentors to younger, aspiring Shawn Carters Scholars.

Horticulture Scholarships - Scholarships.com

Available: Spring **Deadline:** April 30

Need a membership. The Oregon Association of Nurseries is offering a scholarship for seniors planning on majoring in horticulture and related fields.

National Native American Youth Initiative

Available: To be determined **Deadline:** N/A

The National Native American Youth Initiative is an intense enrichment program funded by the Office of Minority Health and the National Institutes of Health, National Institute on Minority Health and Health Disparities. NNAYI is designed to better prepare American Indian/Alaska Native (AI/AN) high school students ages 16-18 to remain in the academic pipeline and pursue a career in the health professions and//or biomedical research.

Native American Journalist Association Scholarship

Available: To be determined **Deadline:** April

Any Native American graduating high school senior or college student pursuing a career in media is eligible. All student applicants must be current NAJA members in good standing. Annual memberships cost \$10 for high school students and \$20 for college students.

May

Accenture American Indian Scholarship Available: January **Deadline** May 1st The Accenture American Indian Scholarship program was established in 2005 to build personal and lasting relationships with students who will become the future leaders in the American Indian Communities and possibly with Accenture. At that time, the scholarship sought the very brightest American Indian and Alaskan Native undergraduate and graduate students; however, recently, Accenture LLP is limiting the funds to the very brightest American Indian and Alaska Native incoming freshman and undergraduate students.

Ann C Thornton Memorial Fund Scholarship - Coos County Indian

Available: Open **Deadline:** May 1

Four \$1,000 awards will be selected for American Indian/ Alaska Native students who live in Oregon and who are enrolled (or will be enrolled) in a college or university in the fall.

LM Scholarship Program

Available: Spring **Deadline:** May 31

Offered by Leavitt Machinery, a forklift company, the applicant is expected to be enrolled in a degree program (2-years or greater) in the Fall. Must have a GPA of 3.0 or higher, the scholarship value is \$500.

June

Oregon Promise

Available: Open **Deadline:** June 2 for HS grads

Oregon Promise is a state grant program that covers some or all of the tuition at an Oregon community college. Oregon Promise is for recent Oregon high school graduates and GED recipients who enroll in an Oregon community college within six months of graduation. Must have Oregon community college on Fafsa.

Nez Perce Homeland Project & Tamkaliks Scholarships

Available: February **Deadline:** June

Four \$500 scholarships will be awarded. Three of these go to Native Americans; one is awarded to a Wallowa County student. One of the purposes of the Tamkaliks Celebration is to promote cultural understanding.

Varying Deadlines

Army ROTC Scholarships

Available: Open

Start Strong in life – enroll in Army Reserve Officers' Training Corps (ROTC), the college elective for undergraduate and graduate students that provides unrivalled leadership training for success in any career field. If you have a passion for it, you can find a place to fit in the Army as an officer and get the training you need to turn that passion into a career. The Four-Year High School Scholarship is for high school students planning on attending a four-year college program.

Yakama Nation Higher Education

The Yakama Nation Tribal Council and Education Committee approved financial assistance for high school students who participate in college prep programs while still attending high school. These funds are intended to assist the students with costs related to college prep courses designed to give students a head start in their college tracks in pursuit of a college degree.

Oregon Tribal Student Grant | Office of Student Access and Completion (oregonstudentaid.gov)

Available: Open **Deadline:** August 1st

The Oregon Tribal Student Grant program was established to provide grants to eligible Oregon tribal students to offset the <u>cost of attendance</u> for attending eligible Oregon colleges and universities. Current continuing and new students are encouraged to apply for this grant for the

2022-2023 academic year. The grant is intended to cover the average cost of attendance after all federal and state grants/scholarships have been applied.

First Nations' Native Agriculture Scholarship

Available: Summer **Deadline:** September 30

Wells Fargo Scholarship for Undergraduates

Available: January Deadline: May 1

The Wells Fargo Scholarships for Undergraduate American Indian and Alaska Native Students will fund full-time and degree-seeking college freshmen, sophomores, juniors and seniors who hold a current GPA of 2.7 or higher with up to \$5,000 for one year of study in any chosen major at any accredited institution in the United States.

Wilson-Hooper Veterinary Medicine Assistance Program

Available: January **Deadline:** May 1

The Wilson-Hooper Veterinary Medicine Assistance Program provides scholarships to students pursuing veterinary medicine and veterinary technician degrees. If you love animals and possess the desire to pursue a degree at an accredited college or university, you may be qualified for funding from the Wilson-Hooper Vet Med Assistance Program.

LM Scholarship Program

Available: Open **Deadline:** May 31st

Offered by Leavitt Machinery, a forklift company, the applicant is expected to be enrolled in a degree program (2-years or greater) in the fall. Must have a GPA of 3.0 or higher, the scholarship value is \$500.

Oregon Student Child Care Grant

Available: January **Deadline:** May 31st

The Oregon Student Child Care Grant Program was established to assist parents enrolled in postsecondary education obtain safe, dependable care that supports their children's development while allowing completion of the parent's academic programs.

American Indian College Fund Full Circle Scholarship

Available: January **Deadline:** May 31

American Indian College Fund provides scholarship support to each tribal college and university and administers several scholarship programs to American Indian and Alaska Native undergraduate and graduates students attending tribal colleges and state and private universities.

AAIA Allogan Slagle Memorial Scholarship

Available: May **Deadline:** 30 days after opening

AAIA provides undergraduate and graduate scholarships (including PhD, Law, and Medicine) to Native American/Alaska Native students from tribes that are not on the list of tribes recognized by the federal government in the amount of \$1,500 per year.

June

AAIA Sequoyah Graduate Scholarship

Available: Open **Deadline:** June 1

Scholarship availability is based on funds, earlier the better. The Association on American Indian Affairs offers Sequoyah Graduate Scholarships to students in any curriculum. This scholarship does not automatically renew. Students are eligible to apply on a yearly basis.

AAIA Undergrad Scholarships

Available: May **Deadline:** June 1

These five scholarship will continue to fund your college career if accepted. \$1,500 available each year. Must be enrolled in your tribe; must be attending an accredited school full time both fall and spring semesters; must be seeking an Associate's or Bachelor's degree. Open to high school seniors who will be entering college in the fall, College Freshman, sophomores, juniors and seniors.

BIE STEM Loan for Service

Available: January **Deadline:** June 1

AIGC administers a Bureau of Indian Education contract to provide financial assistance in the form of loans to eligible American Indian and Alaska Natives seeking graduate and professional degrees in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM). The goal is to promote opportunity for careers with tribal governments, Bureau of Indian Affairs and Bureau of Indian Affairs—funded organizations on and off reservations. Loans are paid back at the rate of one year of service for one year of funding.

Law Student Diversity Scholarship and Application

Available: Open **Deadline:** June 1

Open to student currently in their first or second year of law school or entering law school in the fall. Must be of an ethnic or racial minority. 3.0 GPA

Loan for Service

Available: to be determined **Deadline:** June 1

AIGC administers a Bureau of Indian Education contract to provide financial assistance in the form of loans to eligible American Indian and Alaska Natives seeking graduate and professional degrees. The goal is to promote opportunity for careers with tribal governments, Bureau of Indian Affairs and Bureau of Indian Affairs—funded organizations on and off reservations. Loans are paid back at the rate of one year of service for one year of funding.

Paumanauke Native American Indian Scholarship

Available: February **Deadline:** June 1

Scholarship is open to tribally enrolled Native American Indians attending colleges, universities, and accredited post-secondary educational institutions on a full-time basis.

Facebook Journalism Project - NAJA

Available: Spring **Deadline:** June 6

Any Native American graduating high school senior or college student pursuing a career in media is eligible. All student applicants must be current NAJA members in good standing. Annual memberships cost \$10 for high school students and \$20 for college students.

A&F Business Consultants

Available: January **Deadline:** June 12

The A&F Scholarships are available to all high school seniors and students currently registered in any accredited post-secondary institution. To apply for this scholarship you will need to write an essay. The essay should be between 500 and 1,000 words. Describe your educational career and life goals. Explain your plan for achieving these goals. Include your degree-major, why you selected it, and how this will help you achieve your goals.

Continental Society Daughters of Indian Wars Scholarships

Available: Open **Deadline:** June 15

Open to Native American, certified tribal members with plans to work on a reservation. Must be an undergraduate junior or senior accepted to or already attending an accredited college/university, be carrying at least eight semester hours, and have a minimum 3.0 GPA. Must be US citizen and demonstrate financial need.

Big Sun Scholarship for Student Athletes

Available: Open **Deadline:** June 19

The BigSun Organization is proud to be able to help young athletes succeed in their academic pursuits. In order to do our part we are offering an annual scholarship to a deserving student. All student athletes are eligible for this award, regardless of which sport they are participating in.

Nez Perce Homeland Project & Tamkaliks Scholarships

Available: Spring **Deadline:** June 30th

Four \$500 scholarships will be awarded. Three of these go to Native Americans; one is awarded to a Wallowa County student. One of the purposes of the Tamkaliks Celebration is to promote cultural understanding.

Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs Scholarship

Available: Open **Deadline:** July 1

Warm Springs students, must have a HS diploma/GED, complete FAFSA, complete below 100 level classes, min.15 credits with a 2.50 GPA. Please refer to site for additional info.

Accenture American Indian Scholarship Fund

Available: January **Deadline:** July 5

Students seeking a degree and career in fields of study including: various engineering, computer science, operations management, management, finance, marketing and other business oriented fields; Entering a U.S. accredited college or university full-time, degree seeking college undergraduate freshmen. Demonstrate character, personal merit and commitment to the American Indian Community locally and/or nationally.

NLA Foundation Scholarship

Available: June Deadline: July 30th

Scholarship is open to minority students who are pursuing undergraduate training in Computer Science, Aviation, Nursing, or Music.

Varying Deadlines

C.T.U.I.R Higher Education & Adult Vocational Training Scholarship

Attached is the application for higher education or adult vocational training for CTUIR Members. Summer term application deadline is the first Friday in December.

C.T.U.I.R Tribal Health Commission Scholarship

If you are interested in continuing your education in a health related field, and are a CTUIR Member, contact CTUIR Health Commission. Winter term application deadline is the first Friday in November.

American Indian Services Scholarship

Available: Oct 2, Feb 2, April 2, and Jun 2. **Deadline:** Feb 1, April 1, June 1, and Oct 1,

Applicant must be one-quarter (1/4) Northern-Native American Indian and enrolled in undergraduate studies at university, junior college, or technical school. Applicant must have at least a 2.25 GPA. Deadline is August 1st for term starting in Oct/Nov/Dec.

American Indian Nurse Scholarship Awards

The National Society of The Colonial Dames of America has provided a small number of scholarship awards to assist students of American Indian heritage who are pursuing degrees in nursing or in the field of health care and health education. Eligible students receive per semester and the money is to be used strictly for tuition, books or fees applicable to the student's approved program.

George A. Strait Minority Scholarships

George A. Strait Minority Scholarships are awarded annually to college graduates with meaningful law library experience who are members of a minority group as defined by current U.S. government guidelines, are degree candidates in an accredited library or law school, and who intend to have a career in law librarianship. Applicants must show evidence of financial need. To apply for the George A. Strait Minority Scholarship, you must also qualify for one of the AALL Educational Scholarships.

IIE UPS Scholarship for Minority Students

Available: Open **Deadline:** November 15

IIE's scholarship and fellowship program is in place to recognize graduate and undergraduate industrial engineering students for academic excellence and campus leadership. The UPS Scholarship for Minority Students is available to undergraduate students enrolled in any school in the United States and its territories, Canada, and Mexico, where the school's industrial engineering program or equivalent is accredited by an agency or organization recognized by IIE and the student is pursuing a course of study in industrial engineering.

Native Agriculture and Food Systems (NAFSI) Scholarship Program

Available: January **Deadline:** to be determined

First Nations will award six \$1,000 scholarships annually to Native American college students majoring in agriculture and agriculture related fields, including not limited to: Agribusiness management, agri-science technologies, agronomy, animal husbandry, aquaponics, fisheries and wildlife, food production and safety, food-related policy and legislation, horticulture, irrigation science, plant based nutrition, and sustainable agriculture or food systems.

National Elks Foundation Emergency Education Grant

Available: May 1 and October 31 **Deadline:** To be determined

This program provides financial assistance to children of deceased or totally disabled Elks, who wish to obtain or further their college education.

Facebook Journal Scholarship - NAJA

Available: Spring **Deadline:** To be determined

A scholarship up to \$2,000 is open to Native American students pursuing journalism degrees at a higher learning institution during the fall semester. Applicant must be a member of NAJA.

Oregon Tribal Student Grant | Office of Student Access and Completion (oregonstudentaid.gov)

Available: Open **Deadline:** August 1st

The Oregon Tribal Student Grant program was established to provide grants to eligible Oregon tribal students to offset the <u>cost of attendance</u> for attending eligible Oregon colleges and universities. Current continuing and new students are encouraged to apply for this grant for the 2022-2023 academic year. The grant is intended to cover the average cost of attendance after all federal and state grants/scholarships have been applied.

Internships/Fellowships

CTUIR Internship

Available: January Deadline: until all spots are filled

CTUIR Tribal members only, must be a current college student. Opportunity to gain work experience by working for a CTUIR Tribal Program or Yellowhawk. Work during your summer/winter breaks. Contact CTUIR Higher Education Manager for more information.

NCAI Native Graduate Health Fellowship

Available: Open **Deadline:** January 3

Must be member of an American Indian tribe and must be new or continuing full-time student in the Fall pursuing graduate in any health-related area, including Doctor of Medicine (MD), Master of Nursing (MSN), Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP), Master of Public Health (MPH), Master of Pharmacy (MPharm).

NCAI: Wilma Mankiller Fellowship

Available: Open **Deadline:** Fellowship (January 3)

Internship with NCAI offers an opportunity for young leaders from throughout Indian Country—as well as for other young leaders with an interest in Native affairs, to be on the front lines of legislative action and policy development.

AISES – Bonneville Power Administration: Transmission Services Internship

Available: December **Deadline:** January 31

The internship will be located in Vancouver, WA. Interns will assist senior engineers working on drawings, performing planning functions, design, testing equipment, participating in field visits and other activities related to project development. The ideal student will have a background in electrical, civil or mechanical engineering.

Udall Native American Congressional Internship

Available: Open **Deadline:** January 31

The Native American Congressional Internship Program provides American Indian students the opportunity to gain experience with the federal legislative process in order to understand the government-to-government relationship between Tribes and the federal government.

ITEP Environmental Education Outreach Program Internship

Available: Open **Deadline:** February 28

Since 1994, the Institute for Tribal Environmental Professionals (ITEP) has offered student summer internships for Native American and other college students with funding from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA). This program provides the opportunity for students to gain hands-on skills with EPA or other governmental and tribal environmental offices.

Native American Political Leadership Program

Available: Open **Deadline:** March 1

The Native American Political Leadership Program (NAPLP) is a full scholarship for Native American students who want to take part in Semester in Washington Politics. It is open to undergraduate and graduate students.

AIGC Fellowship

Available: Open **Deadline:** June 1

Graduate fellowships are monetary awards made to American Indian and Alaska Native graduate or professional full-time, degree-seeking students, who meet all eligibility criteria. The fellowship amount is typically between \$1000 and \$5000 per academic year (not including summer), and varies from year to year, depending on the number of qualified applicants, the availability of funds and unmet financial need.

American Fisheries Society

The American Fisheries Society has many internships and need for assistants all available for undergraduate students, with only one position for a graduate student.

Oregon Community Colleges Foundation Scholarships

<u>Blue Mountain Community College Foundation Scholarships</u> BMCC Foundation post all local and national scholarship opportunities. Most applications are due March for funding fall term. Most scholarships require you to submit an essay.

<u>Central Oregon Community College Foundation Scholarships</u> COCC Foundation offers nearly 350 awards totaling \$1.5 million for local students. Easy to apply for and can be renewed for two additional years.

Lane Community College Foundation Scholarships LCC Foundation offers scholarships for students.

Mt. Hood Community College Scholarships Available for any MHCC students, or any students who have applied for admission to MHCC. The regular application cycle opens during winter quarter.

<u>Portland Community College Foundation Scholarships</u> PCC Foundation awards scholarships to PCC students who may not otherwise be able to afford an education. Scholarships pay for tuition, fees, and books.

Oregon Universities Foundation Scholarship

<u>Eastern Oregon University Scholarships</u> Several scholarships are available throughout the year for students enrolled at EOU. Refer to site for application dates and deadlines.

Oregon Health Sciences University Scholars for a Healthy Oregon SHOI funding provides full tuition and applicable fees for a limited number of eligible students entering specific clinical degree programs at OHSU. In return, funding recipients agree to practice as a healthcare practitioner in a rural or underserved community in Oregon for a minimum of one year longer than the total years of funding received.

<u>Oregon Institute of Technology Scholarships</u> Several scholarships are available for students enrolled at OIT. Refer to website for application dates and deadlines.

<u>Oregon State University Scholarships</u> Several scholarships opportunities are available for students enrolled at OSU. Refer to the website for application dates and deadlines.

<u>Portland State University NASCC Scholarship</u> The Native American Student and Community Center scholarship who demonstrate a commitment to Native American communities. Must demonstrate need.
