- Spring Chinook production of 500,000 yearling smolts, annually; first returning adults in 2024-25
- Broodstock collection goal 350 Walla Walla origin spring Chinook adults (630K green eggs)
- Outplant goal 200 adults
- Holding & spawning of Umatilla River spring Chinook (560 adults)
- Staffing 5 employees; Manager, Assistant Mgr., Fisheries Technician III (2), Maintenance Supervisor
