



2019 EMERGENCY LOWER UMATILLA RIVER PACIFIC LAMPREY FISHERY

Pursuant to Chapter 2 of the Fish and Wildlife Code of the Confederated Tribes of the Umatilla Indian Reservation, the Fish and Wildlife Commission has the authority to establish emergency regulations for Umatilla ceremonial, subsistence, and commercial fisheries. Pursuant to that authority, the Fish and Wildlife Commission adopted the following regulations.

Area: Lower Umatilla River Only; below Threemile Dam (see specifications below).

Dates: Open daily from 5:00 AM on Wednesday May 15 through 12:00 AM Friday May 31, 2019. This fishery may close earlier due to low returns and/or high catch rates. The FWC identified a harvest target of 500 adult Pacific lamprey.

Gear: Hand tools fished from the bank only and occupied at all times. No mesh restriction.

Restrictions: No per person bag limit. Subsistence purposes only.

For Safety Concerns; it shall be unlawful to take or attempt to take fish from within 25 feet above or below fishways (e.g. adult fish ladders at Threemile Dam). There shall be no trespassing/walking on/fishing from hatchery facilities such as fish ladder, fish weir, etc.

Reporting: Fisher(s) are required to report with the Fisheries Program the dates of harvest and total catch within 72 hours. Catch report may be given by contacting Preston Bronson at (541) 429-7277 or Celeste Reves at (541) 429-7293.

Any person, who is a CTUIR tribal member that exercises off-reservation treaty rights shall have in his or her possession a CTUIR tribal identification card.
